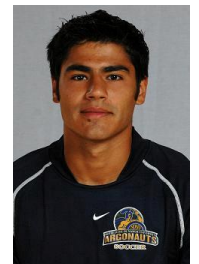

ARGO OF THE WEEK

ANDRES CABALLERO, SR., CAMARILLO, CA SOCCER

Caballero led the Argonaut soccer team to a pair of victories last week, scoring three goals, including the game winner against Hawaii Pacific. His goal against HPU came with three minutes left in the game and propelled the Argos to a 3-2 win. Caballero was also named the men's soccer Pacific West Player of the Week.



Teams

Men's Soccer: 6-7-1 (3-3 PacWest)

Last Week's Results:

def. Hawaii Pacific, 3-2 (10/14): Even after falling behind by two goals in the first half the Notre Dame de Namur men's soccer team never quit and pulled off a come from behind victory over Hawaii Pacific. The Argos downed HPU 3-2, courtesy of Andres Caballero's game winning goal in the 87th minute. HPU controlled most of the first half, out shooting the Argos 6-4 and taking a 2-1 lead into the break. The Sea Warriors got on the board first, netting a pair of goals in less than a minute. Andre Whitt put

HPU up at the 19:54 mark when he dribbled past three Argonaut defenders and beat goalie Rafael Vaquerano. Akihide Adachi struck just 28 seconds later when he took Adam Rieke's rebound and beat the NDNU keeper once again. The Argos did not waste anytime cutting the lead in half, scoring just one minute and 36 seconds later. Brad Katherman's throw-in found its way through the HPU defense to Dorian Virrueta who beat goalie Matt Terry. The score remained 2-1 into the second half until NDNU earned a penalty kick in the 61st minute. Edgar Rivera made the most of the opportunity, scoring his first goal in the season by going low into the left side of the net. Caballero put the Argos up for good when he stole a HPU pass and streaked down the right side. Terry came out of the net, but Caballero put the ball out of his reach and into the corner of the net.

def. Hawaii Hilo, 4-0 (10/10): A pair of early goals helped push Notre Dame de Namur to a 4-0 win over Hawaii Hilo. The Argos scored twice in the first 13 minutes of action and added two more second half goals to improve in 2-3 in Pacific West play. NDNU out shot the Vulcans 18-12 for the game, including a 8-3 advantage in shots on goal. Edgar Flores got the Argos started early with a penalty kick goal in the 5th minute. NDNU scored the second goal of the half in the 13th minute after Carlos Lopez headed a crossing pass from Kyle Hyden over to Dorian Virrueta who found the back of the net. Andres Caballero tacked on both of the Argo goals in the second half, first taking a crossing pass from Jonathon Woolley in the 47th minute and then scoring on a cross from Virrueta in the 68th minute. Mike Jaso and Rafael Vaquerano combined for the shutout for the Argos, making a combined three saves. Marc Fournier made four stops for the Vulcans, but also allowed all four goals.

Women's Soccer: 4-9-1 (3-4 PacWest)

Last Week's Results:

def. Hawaii Pacific, 4-1 (10/14): The Argos scored a pair of goals in both the first and second halves to handle Hawaii Pacific 4-1 and move to 3-4 in Pacific West play. NDNU controlled the ball most of the game, registering 25 shots while HPU took just five. The Argos got the scoring started early, taking a 1-0 lead in the sixth minute on a goal by Lyndsey Schiffman. Later in the half, Sally Olsson's shot hit the post and bounced back into play where Amy Armijo was waiting and headed it into the net. After halftime, the Sea Warriors cut the lead in half on a breakaway goal by Elyshia Sarrett-Pilgrim in the 54th minute. However, that would be as close as HPU would come as the Catherine Ponce scored the final two Argonaut goals to put the game away. Ponce's first goal came in the 61st minute when she took a pass from Armijo off Erin Morrison's corner kick and beat goalkeeper Veronica Ellman. Ponce would find the back of the net just nine minutes later on a crossing pass from Lesley Welch. Allie Howarth picked up the victory for NDNU, making one save and not allowing a goal in her 45 minutes of action. Christina Dito also made a save for the Argos and allowed one goal. Ellman kept HPU in the game with seven saves, but allowed all four NDNU goals.

lost to Hawaii-Hilo, 0-2 (10/10): The Notre Dame de Namur women's soccer team dropped to 2-4 in Pacific West play with a 2-0 defeat at the hands of Hawaii Hilo. The Vulcans scored a pair of second half goal to topple the Argos despite being out shot 16-12. Rebecca Delaney recorded the shutout for UHH, making nine saves while Allie Howarth made six for NDNU. Jani Carmona broke the scoreless tie in the 69th minute when she headed in a corner kick from Megan Pachecano. Pachecano later added an insurance goal in the 90th minute, scoring on a rebound off her own shot. Sally Olsson led the Argos with five shots while Amy Armijo and Kristen Orlando each took three.

Volleyball: 7-13 (4-3 PacWest)

Last Week's Results:

def. Chaminade, 3-0 (10/13): The Notre Dame de Namur volleyball team was clicking on all cylinders as they stormed past Chaminade in a three game sweep. The Argos held a 53-38 kill advantage and committed a season low seven attack errors in route to

a 30-18, 30-24, 30-27 victory. NDNU recorded 18, 21 and 14 kills in the three games and hit .377 for the match. Emily Evans once again led the Argonaut attack, tallying 12 kills and hitting .478. Caitlin Torres tacked on 10 kills while Marissa Miller added nine. Sarah Perry hit .500 for the match with eight kills and three blocks. Pamela Alano dished out a game high 30 assists.

lost to Chaminade, 1-3 (10/12): The Notre Dame de Namur volleyball team dropped their third straight conference match, falling to Chaminade 3-1. The Argos came out on fire, using 23 kills in the first game to down the Swords 30-27. In the second game, NDNU took an early lead before Chaminade rattled off 13 straight points to push ahead and win 30-14. The Swords then took the final two games 30-23 and 30-28. The Argos recorded a season high 14 blocks while also racking up 57 kills. However, Chaminade was one better with 58 kills and tacked on 14 aces. Emily Evans and Sarah Perry led four Argos in double figures with 12 kills each. Marissa Miller added 11 kills and six aces while Ashley Fox tacked on 10 kills and hit .529 for the match. Caitlin Torres picked up eight kills and seven blocks. Chaminade was led by Trina Kauoakamoa's 19 kills, 15 of which came in the first two games. Evelyn Bluthenthal added 15 kills and Samantha Miller tallied 13. Setter Tanya Alvino finished with a game high 51 assists while Lila Sapulo recorded eight aces.

Men (14th place) at Santa Clara (10/13): The Notre Dame de Namur men's cross country team place 14th at Saturday mornings Santa Clara Invitational. The Argos were led by Jose Alcalá's 59th place finish, while Erik Estrada finished just three seconds behind in 62nd. David Santana (85th), Javier Ceja (89th) and Johnny Yerena (92nd) rounded out the Argos score of 387. NDNU is off next week, but will return home to host the Pacific West Conference Championships held at Crystal Springs on October 27th.
