### ARGO OF THE WEEK

#### **MIKE PRESCOTT, SR., SAN MATEO, CA MEN'S GOLF**

Prescott finished tied for 16<sup>th</sup> in the men's season opener, firing a 54-hole score of 229. He finished just 11 shots off the lead while helping the Argos place sixth as a team. Prescott also tied for the best individual round on the team with a one-over-par 73 in the second round.



### Teams

#### **Men's Soccer: 7-7-1 (3-3 PacWest)**

#### *Last Week's Results:*

**def. UC Santa Cruz, 3-2 (10/17):** Three second half goals helped propel the Notre Dame de Namur soccer team to a 3-2 victory over UC Santa Cruz. The Argos and Slugs battled to a scoreless tie through sixty minutes before the teams combined for five goals in the final thirty minutes. The Argos out shot Santa Cruz 14-11 for the game and scored three goals on six shots in the second half. Sean Vogt got the Argos on the board in the 63rd minute when he beat goalkeeper Jared Wheeler after Emmanuel Vasquez sent him a pass from the top of the box. Carlos Lopez followed with a goal four minutes later on a feed from Chris Arceo. The Slugs cut the lead in half with a score by Jeremy Adams off a corner kick in the 72nd minute. The Argos would go on to add a very important

insurance goal in the 84th minute when Andres Caballero broke past the defense and beat Wheeler through the five hole. Santa Cruz would pull within one score two minutes later on Adam Smarte's goal, but that would be as close as they would come. Mike Jaso made two saves in a scoreless first half before Sheldon Steenhuis came in for the second and made a pair of stops.

## **Women's Soccer: 4-9-1 (3-5 PacWest)**

### *Last Week's Results:*

**lost to Dixie State, 3-1 (10/20):** Three first half goals proved to be all Dixie State College would need to defeat Notre Dame de Namur 3-1. The Argos found themselves down early after surrendering three goals in a ten minute span. Dixie out shot the Argos by just one shot, 19-18, but NDNU stayed close with Allie Howarth's career high 11 saves. Erika Mouritsen got Dixie on the board in the 17th minute when she scored the first of her two goals in the half. She dribbled around the defense and beat Howarth to give the Rebels a 1-0 advantage. Six minutes later, Wendy Stratford stole the ball from an Argonaut defender and put Dixie up by two. Mourtsen followed with her second goal, just under five minutes later when she took a crossing pass from Shannon Larson. With the Rebels up by three in the second half, the Argos started to make some noise. NDNU held an 11-7 shot advantage in the half and scored the only goal. Heather Toohey knocked in her first goal of the season on a crossing pass from Julie Loucks to cut the Dixie State lead to two. However, that would be as close as the Argonauts would come as Suzanne Hunt made four saves to preserve the victory.

**lost to CSU Monterey Bay, 3-2 (10/17):** The Notre Dame de Namur women's soccer team took the lead twice in Wednesday's non-conference game with CSU Monterey Bay but still fell short, losing 3-2. The Argos scored once in each half, but could not hold off the Otters who scored the final two goals of the contest. The Argos took an early lead on a goal by Lesley Welch in the 8th minute of play. Erin Morrison sent a crossing pass to Catherine Ponce who would find Welch all alone on the back post for the goal. The Otters answered three minutes later on a breakaway goal by Sarah Alderson. After the rest of the first half passed without a goal, Ponce put the Argos back on top in the 54th minute. She stole the ball from a Monterey defender before dribbling across the top of the box and firing a shot into the top of the net. Once again, the Otters did not allow the NDNU lead to last long as they tied the game eight minutes later on Alderson's second goal. With just over seven minutes left, Monterey Bay put the game away on a goal by Eva Arzola off a throw-in by Cassidy Bennett.

## **Volleyball: 8-14 (5-6 PacWest)**

### *Last Week's Results:*

**lost to BYU Hawaii, 3-0 (10/20):** The Notre Dame de Namur volleyball wrapped up their four game Hawaii road trip with a loss to BYU Hawaii in three games. The Argos fell 30-22 in all three games and managed just 29 total kills. The Seasideers tallied 50 kills, including 19 in game one and 18 in game two. Sarah Perry led the Argos with nine kills while Caitlin Torres added five kills and five blocks. Lauren Quach recorded 19 digs with Marissa Miller tacking on 13.

**lost to Hawaii Pacific, 3-1 (10/19):** With the Argos looking to pull off a season sweep of Hawaii Pacific, the Sea Warriors got off to a hot start and won in four games. The Notre Dame de Namur volleyball team handled Hawaii Pacific two days earlier, winning in four games. However, the Sea Warriors came out and took the first two games 30-28 and 30-16 to put the Argos in a big hole. NDNU rebounded with a 30-23 victory in the third, but HPU put the match away for good with a 30-21 win in the fourth game. The Argos held a 53-49 kill advantage for the match but committed 29 attack errors and 19 service errors. Marissa Miller led NDNU with 14 kills and 18 digs while Emily Evans was the other Argonaut in double figures with 10. Pamela Alano finished with 26 assists and Sarah Perry added five blocks.

**lost to BYU Hawaii, 3-0 (10/17):** The Notre Dame de Namur women's volleyball team could not make it two wins in a row to open their Hawaii trip, falling to BYU Hawaii 3-0. The Argos struggled from the start, managing just 10 kills and committing 10 errors in a 30-14 loss in game one. The Seasideers kept up their pace in the second and third game, combining for 38 kills in two 30-22 wins. BYU Hawaii held a 52-34 kill advantage for the game while the Argos also committed 25 attack errors. Emily Evans was the only Argonaut in double figures with 12 kills.

**def. Hawaii Pacific, 3-1 (10/16):** The Argos four match road trip to Hawaii started off in impressive fashion as NDNU downed Hawaii Pacific in four games. The first two games were easily handled by the Argos, 30-22 and 30-18 before HPU rebounded with a 32-30 win in the third. However, NDNU put the match away with a 30-20 victory in the fourth game. NDNU held just a 64-61 kill advantage for the game, but used 17 service aces and eight blocks to pull away. The Argonauts also hit at least .200 and registered 14 or more kills in each game. Marissa Miller led three Argos in double figures with 15 kills while Emily Evans and Caitlin Torres finished just behind her with 14 and 13 kills respectively. Sarah Perrey added nine kills and five aces. Setters Shasta Millhollin and Pamela Alano each recorded 26 assists and three aces.

## Men's Golf

*Last Week's Results:*

**6<sup>th</sup> place at InterWest Wildcat Classic (10/16):** The Notre Dame de Namur men's golf team started off their 2007 fall schedule with a sixth place finish at the InterWest Wildcat Classic. The 54-hole tournament, hosted by Chico State was held at Butte Country Club and featured nine schools. Wayland Baptist won the Classic with a three round score of 886 while the Argos totaled 926. Mike Prescott was the top finisher for the Argonauts placing in a tie for 16<sup>th</sup> with a 229, eleven shots off individual winner Michael Loppnow. Kory Storer and Travis Peterson also placed in the top-20, shooting a 231 and tying in 20<sup>th</sup> place. Freshman Ryan Sheffer finished 34<sup>th</sup> in his first collegiate tournament while Brian Moquin placed 40<sup>th</sup>. Prescott and Peterson tied for the best individual round for NDNU, both shooting 73 in the second round.
