Men's Soccer: 4-7-1 (1-3 PacWest)

Last Week's Results:

tied with San Francisco State, 0-0 (10/5): After 110 minutes of scoreless action, the Notre Dame de Namur men's soccer team and San Francisco State concluded in a 0-0 tie. Both teams had opportunities on offense, but neither one could get find the net. The Gators out shot the Argos 20-16, but NDNU recorded eight shots on goal to six from SFSU. Goalies Mike Jaso and Israel Cisneros each came up big for their respective teams. Jaso stopped six San Francisco State shots while Cisneros turned the Argos away eight times. Andres Caballero recorded three shots on goal for NDNU with Robert Morini adding two of his own.

Volleyball: 6-11 (3-2 PacWest)

Last Week's Results:

lost to Hawaii Hilo, 2-3 (10/6): The Notre Dame de Namur volleyball team dropped a five game heartbreaker to first place Hawaii Hilo 3-2. The Argos came out on fire, taking the first two games, 30-26 and 31-29 while racking up 28 kills in the process. However, UHH rallied after falling behind 2-0 to win the final three games, 30-17, 30-28 and 15-13, and take the match. The Vulcans out killed the Argos 71-65 and also added 17 total blocks. With the match tied at 2-2, Hawaii Hilo came out fast in the final game and took a 11-7 lead. The Argos then mounted a rally of their own and tied the score at 13 before the Vulcans won the final two points. Emily Evans recorded a NDNU season high and a career high 23 kills while hitting .436 for the match. Marissa Miller followed up her own 20 kill performance with 14 kills of her own. Setter Shasta Millhollin finished with 21 assists and five kills while Sarah Perry added four aces and three blocks.

lost to Hawaii Hilo, 1-3 (10/5): The Notre Dame de Namur volleyball team saw its six game conference winning streak end with a 3-1 loss to Hawaii Hilo. The Argos started this season off 3-0 in Pacific West play after winning their final three conference matches last year. However, the Vulcans put an end to the streak and took over sole possession of first place in the PacWest with a 4-0 record. Hilo came out fast, recording 18 kills in each of the first two games and winning 30-25 and 30-23. The Argos battled back in the third, hitting .395 for the game and using 19 kills to down the Vulcans 30-28. The fourth game was all Hawaii Hilo as the Vulcans put the match away with a 30-19 victory. Marissa Miller racked up a season high 20 kills and hit .485 for match while Emily Evans added 10 kills. Pamela Alano and Shasta Millhollin combined for 42 assists with Caitlin Torres and Sarah Perry each tallying four blocks.

Last Week's Results:

Men (7th place) at Triton Invitational (10/6): The Notre Dame de Namur men's cross country team finished seventh overall, third in Division II at the Triton Invitational. The Argos placed behind host school UC San Diego as well as Cal Poly Pomona but had a pair of runners in the top-10. Erik Estrada finished in fifth place while Javier Ceja came in seventh. Jose Alcalá (12th), Johnny Yerena (17th) and David Santana (18th) rounded out the NDNU score.

Women ran at Triton Invitational (10/6): The Notre Dame de Namur women's cross country team competed in their fifth race of the season at the Triton Invitational. Three Argonaut runner completed the race, led by Ashley Hughey 38th place finish. Stacie Nowark placed 49th while Cyndi Castor finished in 59th place.

Women's Golf:

T(5th) at Otter Invitational (10/1-2): After finishing the first round of the Lady Otter Invitational in 8th place, the Notre Dame de Namur women's golf team surged into a fifth place tie with a stellar second round. The Argos shot a 341 on the opening 18 holes before responding with a 328, the third best score of the second round. NDNU's total score of 669 placed them in a tie with Hawaii Hilo. The Invitational featured 18 schools and was ultimately won by Chico State with a 646. Kelly Ashton once again was the top individual for the Argonauts, finishing in 5th place with a 157. Brittany Carrera fired a 163 to tie for 11th place while Sierra Summer (176), Nicole Burt (176) and Kelly Owen (179) rounded out the Argos score.
