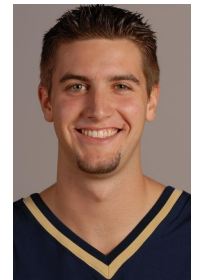

### ARGO OF THE WEEK

#### **DAN BERGERON, JR., SUNNYVALE, CA MEN'S BASKETBALL**

Bergeron helped lead the Argos to a 1-1 record at the Central Washington Classic last weekend. In the first game, an 85-84 overtime win against CWU, Bergeron hit the game winning free throw with 2 seconds left. He also recorded a double-double, scoring 13 points and grabbing 14 rebounds. For the tournament, Bergeron averaged 8.5 points per game and 10.0 rebounds per game.



### Teams

#### Men's Basketball: 1-1

#### *Last Week's Results:*

**lost to Northwest Nazarene, 65-69 (11/17):** A day after defeating Central Washington in overtime, the Notre Dame de Namur men's basketball team dropped a close battle with Northwest Nazarene. Despite having five players in double figures, the Argos fell 69-65. Northwest Nazarene led by as many as 18 in the second half before the Argos cut the lead to two with 27 seconds left. However, NDNU could not tied the game in the final seconds and moved to 1-1 on the season. Eric Bossom (14), Chris Edwards (13), Chris Clock (11), Aaron Parker (11) and Ryan Cooper all reached double figures for the Argonauts. Cooper was named to the All-Tournament Team after averaging 17.5 points per game.

**def. Central Washington, (ot) 85-84 (11/16):** The Notre Dame de Namur and Central Washington men's basketball teams needed an extra five minutes to determine who would win the opening game of the 2007-08 season. The Argos would eventually prevail on a Dan Bergeron free throw with two seconds left to down the host school 85-84. The first half was all NDNU, as they used runs of 13-3 and 11-2 to take a nine point lead into the break. However, the Wildcats responded in the second half, erasing the deficit and taking a 50-49 lead with 10:53 left to play. The Argos pushed back ahead and led by six with three minutes remaining, but CWU scored seven of the last eight points to send the game into overtime. In the extra session, NDNU never trailed, eventually taking the lead for good with Bergeron's free throw. The Argos shot 51% for the game, including 54% in the first half, and hit 11 of 21 from behind the arc. Ryan Cooper led all scorers with 25 points, hitting 5-6 from three and all eight of his free throws. Chris Clock knocked down four threes of his own on the way to 21 points in just 16 minutes. Bergeron recorded a double double, scoring 13 points and grabbing 14 rebounds while Aaron Parker also reached double figures with 10 points.

## Women's Basketball: 0-2

*Last Week's Results:*

**lost to Humboldt State, 90-70 (11/17):** Humboldt State had three players in double figures, led by Kayla Henry with 17 points and five rebounds. Trisha Alaba tacked on 15 points and Jennifer Enos added 15 points and six assists. The Lumberjacks shot a blistering 65% from the field in the second half to bust the game open. Cory Riley and Jennifer Dreessen each scored 14 points for the Argos.

**lost to CSU San Bernardino, 36-68 (11/16):** The Argos struggled from start, hitting just one of their first 18 shots and shooting just 18% in the half. Meanwhile, the Coyotes hit 15 of 37 shots, including seven three points to jump ahead. The second half was a different story for NDNU, outscoring CSUSB 24-21 and forcing 14 turnovers. Cory Riley led NDNU with 10 points, four rebounds and three assists while Jennifer Dreessen grabbed 10 rebounds. Marianne Bautista hit three of four shots on her way to seven points off the bench.
