ARGOS OF THE WEEK

ERIN MORRISON, SR., PARK CITY, UT WOMEN'S SOCCER

Erin scored a pair of goals and added in assist in helping the Argos to a 2-1 week. She registered at least one point in each game, including a pair of game winning goals. On Monday, Morrison's goal in the 64th minute gave the Argos a 1-0 victory over Hawaii Hilo. On Wednesday, she did it again, scoring the first goal in NDNU's 2-0 win against Chaminade. In the final game of her career on Friday, she recorded an assist on the Argos only goal.



Teams

Men's Soccer: 10-9-1 (6-4 PacWest)

Last Week's Results:

def. BYU Hawaii, 2-1(2OT) (11/2): With less than two minutes left in the second overtime, senior Andres Caballero ended the Argonauts season with a game winning goal. The Notre Dame de Namur men's soccer team closed out the year with a 2-1 victory over BYU Hawaii, improving the Argos overall record to 10-9-1. The Argos also sealed second place in the conference with a 6-4 record. After a scoreless first half, the Argos got on the board early in the second with Emmanuel Vasquez's goal in the 51st minute. Vasquez received the corner kick from Edgar Rivera and beat goalie Doug Hansen. Michael Akinaka knotted the score at 1-1 in the 82nd minute on a penalty kick that would send the game to overtime. Both teams battled through a scoreless first overtime before Caballero scored with just under one and a half minutes left in the second overtime. Rivera once again recorded the assist and sent the Argos home with the win.

def. Chaminade, 3-1 (10/31): The Notre Dame de Namur men's soccer team overcame an early deficit to take down Chaminade 3-1. The Argos out shot the Swords 12-3 while improving 5-4 in Pacific West play. Chaminade got on the board first when a throw-in was mishandled by goalie Mike Jaso and found the back of the net. Andres Caballero evened the score in the 31st

minute before Carlos Lopez gave the Argos a one goal lead with 24 seconds left in the first half. Edgar Flores added an insurance goal in the 48th minute off a feed from Jonathon Woolley. Jaso picked up the win in net for NDNU, making one save.

lost to Hawaii-Hilo, 2-1 (10/29): The Notre Dame de Namur men's soccer team could not overcome an early one goal lead, falling to Hawaii Hilo 2-1. The Argos dropped to 4-4 in Pacific West play as the Vulcans scored on their only two shots on goal. NDNU took the lead just over two minutes into the game when Andres Caballero took a crossing pass from Dorian Virrueta and beat goalie Marc Fournier. The Vulcans answered back less than a minute later on a goal by Luis Lanz. Hilo put themselves up for good later in the half when Kyle Cabison scored off an indirect kick by Dustin Daley. The second half passed without a goal as Fournier buckled down in net for the Vulcans, making six saves.

Women's Soccer: 7-12-1 (6-6 PacWest)

Last Week's Results:

lost to BYU Hawaii, 4-1 (11/2): The Notre Dame de Namur women's soccer team fell to BYU Hawaii 4-1 in their final game of the season. The Argos ended the season with a 6-6 Pacific West Conference record, placing them fourth. Ashlee Hinojosa gave the Argos a lead going into the half, scoring in the 24th minute after taking a pass from Erin Morrison and beating goalkeeper Becky Ploeger. The Seaside responded in the second half, scoring four goals and out shooting NDNU 6-3. Stephanie Wright tied the game at 1-1 a little over a minute into the half. Jill Harr would go on to add a pair of goals and Kristi Astin scored on a penalty kick to preserve the victory.

def. Chaminade, 2-0 (10/31): For the third straight game the Notre Dame de Namur women's soccer team did not allow a goal in defeating a Pacific West opponent. The Argos out shot the Swords 22-3 for the game, including a 15-0 advantage in the second half. Cristina Dito and Allie Howarth combined on the shutout, extending NDNU's streak without allowing a goal to 297 minutes. Erin Morrison put the Argos up in the 22nd minute after she took a crossing pass from Lesley Welch and beat goalie Marissa Minor. Catherine Ponce added an insurance goal in the 58th minute to put the game out of reach. Minor made 12 saves for the Swords to keep the game close while Dito made one for the Argos.

def. Hawaii-Hilo, 1-0 (10/29): For the second consecutive game, Allie Howarth and the Notre Dame de Namur women's soccer team held their competition scoreless. The Argos pulled out a 1-0 victory over PacWest foe Hawaii Hilo, avenging a 2-0 loss to the Vulcans earlier this month. The Argos were out shot 13-5 for the game but Howarth came up big, making seven saves while recording her third shutout of the season. Erin Morrison scored the lone goal of the game, her third of the season, in the 64th minute. Goalkeeper Rebecca Delaney fell down in an attempt to get the ball and Morrison was there to put it into the empty net.

Volleyball: 11-17 (7-6 PacWest)

Last Week's Results:

def. Grand Canyon, 3-1 (11/3): The four Notre Dame de Namur seniors celebrating Senior Day came up big in the Argos 3-1 victory over PacWest rival Grand Canyon. Emily Evans, Marissa Miller, Sarah Perry and Shasta Millhollin, all playing in their final home game combined for 41 of NDNU's 67 kills. The Argos improved to 7-6 in conference play with one match remaining. The Argos came out strong, taking the first game 30-19 before the Antelopes scored the final four points to win the second game 31-29. In the third, NDNU rattled off 11 straight points and handled GCU 30-14. The fourth game was close throughout, but with the score tied at 28-28 NDNU won the final two points. Marissa Miller led five players in double digits with 15 kills and added 20 digs. Sarah Perry, Kirby Haynes and Caitlin Torres each tacked on 11 kills with Emily Evans registering 10. Shasta Millhollin finished with five kills and 18 assists, while Pamela Alano recorded eight of the Argos 18 aces on the night.

def. Grand Canyon, 3-0 (11/2): Five different Argonauts recorded at least five kills as the Notre Dame de Namur volleyball team pulled to 6-6 in the PacWest with a three game sweep of Grand Canyon. The Argos used 11 aces and 10 team blocks to overcome the Antelopes 39-36 kill advantage. GCU led late into the first game, taking a 25-19 lead at one point. However, NDNU fought back and overtook the 'Lopes to pull out the win 30-28. The Argos controlled the second game, winning 30-21 before closing out the match with a 30-26 win in a back and forth third game. Caitlin Torres and Marissa Miller each recorded eight kills to lead the NDNU attack. Torres added six blocks and Miller tacked on three aces and 11 digs. Sarah Perry registered six kills, six aces and three blocks while Pamela Alano and Shasta Millhollin combined for 29 assists.

lost to CSU Monterey Bay, 3-0 (10/30): After a pair of hard fought games, the Notre Dame de Namur volleyball team was swept in a non-conference match with CSU Monterey Bay. The Argos stayed close in the first two games, falling 31-29 and 30-28. The third game was all CSUMB as the Otters won 30-22. Marissa Miller turned in a great performance for the Argos, registering 14 kills and committing just one error. She also tacked on 13 digs and four blocks. Sarah Perry added eight kills while Shauna Folan recorded a game high 17 digs.

Last Week's Results:

10th place at Dennis Rose Intercollegiate (10/30): The defending champion Notre Dame de Namur men's golf team struggled in their attempt to repeat, finishing in tenth place at the Dennis Rose Intercollegiate. The Argos shot a 54-hole total of 930, three strokes behind PacWest rival Grand Canyon for ninth place. Kory Storer was the top Argonaut individual, firing a 229 and tying for 31st place. Storer shot an opening round 69 to take possession of first place, but followed up his three-under-par round with a 79 and 81. Brian Moquin finished 48th with a score of 235 while Ryan Sheffer (51), Travis Peterson (52) and Mike Prescott (t-56) rounded out the NDNU golfers.

Women's Golf

Last Week's Results:

8th place at Dennis Rose Intercollegiate (10/30): The Notre Dame de Namur women's golf team closed out their 2007 Fall schedule with a 8th place finish at the Dennis Rose Intercollegiate. The 54-hole tournament at the Mauna Lani in Kona, Hawaii featured 12 teams and was won by Cal Baptist. The Argos shot a total score of 1031 and finished just five strokes behind Grand Canyon for seventh place. Brittany Carrera and Kelly Ashton were once again the top individuals for the Argonauts, both finishing in the top-15. Carrera fired a 248 to place in a tie for 11th while Ashton's 251 put her in 14th place. Sierra Summers (266), Jaime Zunini (271) and Kelly Owen (272) rounded out the Argonauts score. Ashton recorded the best single round score of the tournament for the Argos, shooting a 78 in the opening round.
