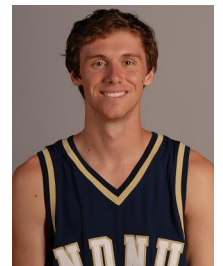

The Notre Dame de Namur men's basketball team came up short against a pair of CCAA teams, falling 79-56 to Humboldt State and 63-59 to Sonoma State. The Argos, who traveled to Sonoma for the Ron Logsdon Classic struggled on Friday against the Jacks before nearly upsetting the home team on Saturday.

In Friday's contest, Humboldt used a 20-2 first half run to jump out to a 43-25 halftime lead. The Argos held the rebounding advantage 35-30 but committed 22 turnovers to just seven from HSU. Chris Clock knocked down six 3-pointers on his way to a team high 20 points. Chris Edwards tacked on nine points while Dan Bergeron added six points and eight rebounds. Devin Peel scored a game high 21 points and CY Vandermeer poured in 15 points and grabbed eight rebounds to pace the Lumberjacks.

On Saturday, the Argos started slow, falling behind 13-7 before using a 12-0 run to take a six point lead. The Seawolves rallied back and took a two point advantage into the break. NDNU struggled in the second, falling behind by as many as 11 with just four minutes to play. However, the Argos cut the deficit to just two with an 11-2 run before Andrew Kochevar knocked down a three in the final minute to put the game out of reach. Clock once again paced the Argos offense, scoring a game high 19 points and earning a spot on the Ron Logsdon All-Tournament Team. Aaron Parker and Dustin Graul each chipped in 10 points while Dan Bergeron finished with seven points, six rebounds and four steals. Kochevar scored all 13 of his points in the second half and Blake Saunders tacked on 11 to pace the Seawolves.

Women's Basketball: 0-7

The Notre Dame de Namur women's basketball team continued their early season struggles with a pair of losses at the Humboldt State Classic. The Argos dropped their opening game to host Lumberjacks 77-50 before falling to Fort Hayes State 50-44 on Saturday.

Against Humboldt, the Argos fell behind early and could not make up the ground. The Jacks shot 47% from the field and made 9-21 threes while the Argos hit 40% of their shots but did make 9 of 17 3-pointers. HSU also held a 16-7 advantage from the free throw line. The Argos bench combined to score 39 of the team's 50 points with Tanaia Keyes leading the way with 12 points. Ashley Wilson knocked down three 3-pointers on the way to nine points while Britni Rathke added four points, eight rebounds and four assists. Jennifer Enos led the Lumberjacks with a game high 15 points and Katie Franci turned in a double-double, scoring 12 points and grabbing 14 rebounds.

On Saturday, the Argos played well defensively, holding Fort Hayes State to just 36% shooting. However, NDNU could not find their touch either and connected on 34% of their shots. After an 8-0 to start the game, Fort Hayes never trailed but the Argos did cut the lead to one with nine minutes remaining. Once again, the NDNU bench provided most of the scoring, tallying 30 of the team's 44 points. Darice Murray led the way with 10 points while Ashley Cavalieri tacked on nine with three 3-pointers. Rathke added eight points and four steals. Brianna Willhite was unstoppable for FHS, netting 21 points and nine rebounds. Sheena Kuntzsch chipped in 16 points and made four 3-pointers.

Women's Soccer

Four Argos Garner All-PacWest Honors

November 29 - The Notre Dame de Namur women's soccer team was well represented as the Pacific West announced their All-Conference Teams on Thursday. Four Argonauts earned All-PacWest accolades, led by Erin Morrison's First Team selection.

Along with Morrison, Catherine Ponce was named to the Second Team and sophomores Kristen Orlando and Sally Olsson received Honorable Mention status.

Morrison, a senior from Park City, Utah had a phenomenal final season. She led the conference in assists with eight, finished first on the team in points with 16 and second in goals with four. Morrison impressed during conference play, scoring 15 points in just 12 PacWest games. She also recorded at least one point in eight of the 12 contests.

Ponce, a sophomore from Las Cruces, New Mexico was a staple at forward for the Argonauts. She led the team in goals with six and finished third in assists with three. Ponce's six goals also tied her for fifth in the conference.

Orlando (San Jose, CA) and Olsson (Hillsboro, OR) earned Honorable Mention status after terrific sophomore seasons. Orlando started all 20 games on defense for NDNU but also chipped in offensively with two goals and an assist. Olsson, made 19 starts in the midfield while registering one goal, two assists and leading the team in shots with 43.

The Argos finished the 2007 season with a 7-12-1 overall record, but finished fourth in the PacWest with a record of 6-6.

Men's Soccer

Seven Argos Earn All-Conference Accolades

December 3 - The Notre Dame de Namur men's soccer team capped off the 2007 season with seven players receiving All-PacWest honors, including freshman Sheldon Steenhuis being named Goalkeeper of the Year. The Argos placed three players on the First Team, two on the Second Team and had two more named Honorable Mention after finishing second in the conference with a 6-4 record.

In addition to earning Goalkeeper of the Year honors, Steenhuis was also named First Team All-PacWest along with Andres Caballero and David Wulff. Midfielders Emmanuel Vasquez and Dorian Virrueta garnered Second Team honors while juniors Carlos Lopez and Sean Vogt received Honorable Mention status.

Steenhuis (Morgan Hill, CA/Live Oak) was terrific in his 12 games for NDNU this year. He wound up with the second-highest save percentage in the PacWest (.760), a stellar 1.41 goals against average to also rank second, and finished second in the conference in shutouts with three.

Senior forward Andres Caballero (Camarillo, CA/Rio Mesa) was the chief offensive threat for NDNU in 2007. He led the Argos in scoring with 19 points on nine goals and one assist and finished second in the conference in goals. Caballero also ranked third in the conference in points, seventh in points per game (0.95), third in goals per game (0.45) and was second in the league with four game-winners. He was at his best in conference play, registering six goals in 10 PacWest games.

Junior defender David Wolfe (San Jose, CA/Wilcox) helped anchor an Argonaut defense that finished second in the conference in goals against average (1.36), goals allowed (28) and shutouts (6).

Senior Emmanuel Vasquez (Corona, CA/Santiago) and junior Dorian Virrueta (Fremont, CA/America) were both staples in the midfield for NDNU. Vasquez finished second on the team with eight points (two goals, four assists) while Virrueta finished third with seven points (two goals, three assists).

Juniors Carlos Lopez (Santa Monica, CA/Santa Monica) and Sean Vogt (Fresno, CA/Clovis West) each turned in impressive debut seasons for the Argos. Lopez appeared in all 20 games and finished with two goals and three assists. Vogt made 17 starts on defense and also chipped in three goals, two of which were game winners.

The Argos concluded the 2007 season with a 10-9-1 record but went 6-2 in their final eight games to capture second place in the Pacific West.

Volleyball

Quach Named Second Team All-PacWest

December 5 – The Notre Dame de Namur volleyball team wrapped up their 2007 season with sophomore libero Lauren Quach receiving All-Conference honors.

Quach (San Francisco, CA/St. Ignatius Prep) was named Second Team All-PacWest after finishing second in the conference with 512 digs. She ranked third in the league with 4.41 digs per game, while appearing in all 116 games. Quach reached double figures in digs 23 times and recorded at least 20 digs eight times. She also topped the 30 dig mark three times, including a career high 40 against Cal State East Bay on September 28th.

The Argos concluded the season with an 11-19 overall record, but finished fourth in the conference with a record of 7-7
