### ARGO OF THE WEEK

#### **ASHLEY WILSON, JR., SAN DIEGO, CA WOMEN'S BASKETBALL**

Wilson averaged 14.5 points per game last week as the Argos traveled to Phoenix and split with first-place Grand Canyon. She shot 45.0% from beyond the arc, making 9 of 20 three-point attempts. In Thursday victory over the Antelopes, Wilson tied a NDNU single game record with seven three-pointers.



## Teams

### Men's Basketball: 8-12 (4-8)

#### *Last Week's Results:*

**lost to Grand Canyon, 74-67 (2/7):** The Notre Dame de Namur men's basketball could not overcome a nine point halftime deficit, falling to Grand Canyon 74-67. The Argos moved to 4-8 in PacWest play with the loss.

Grand Canyon started off hot, shooting 52% in the first half and leading by as many 13 points. The 'Lopes pushed the lead to as many as 17 in the second, but the Argonauts would not go away. Ryan Cooper's three with 26 seconds left cut GCU's lead to three but NDNU would not get any closer. The Antelopes hit four free throws down the stretch to preserve the victory.

Chris Clock led all scorers with 21 points, hitting three 3-pointers and making all eight of his free throws. Cooper finished with 12 points and Dan Bergeron added 10 for NDNU.

**def. Grand Canyon, 77-66 (2/6):** Senior guard Chris Clock set a NDNU single game record with nine 3-pointers as the Argos defeated PacWest rival Grand Canyon 77-66. As a team, the Argos hit 14-20 from behind the arc and improved to 4-7 in conference play with the victory. The Argos jumped out early, using an 18-5 run to take a 12 point lead with just under six minutes remaining in the first half. Clock missed his first three of the half before drilling seven in a row to help NDNU take a 40-28 lead into the break.

For the half, the Argos shot 54%, including 10-14 from behind the arc while holding the 'Lopes to 41% from the field. Clock stayed hot to start the second, hitting his next two 3-pointers to give him nine made threes in a row. However, it was senior point guard Ryan Cooper who carried the Argos in the second half. After scoring just three points in the first, Cooper rebounded with 16 in the second. He also scored 14 straight Argonaut points in the final six minute to preserve the victory.

The Argonauts were even better in the second half, hitting at 59% for the half. Clock finished the game 9-11 from 3-point range to finish with 27 points. Cooper added 19 and four assists while Chris Edwards tacked on a double-double with 14 points and 12 rebounds.

### Women's Basketball: 9-11 (9-3)

#### *Last Week's Results:*

**def. Grand Canyon, 56-52 (2/7):** A day after Grand Canyon snapped the Argonauts seven game winning streak the Notre Dame de Namur women's basketball team rebounded with a 56-52 victory over the first place Antelopes. The Argos improved to 9-3 in conference play and moved within half a game of GCU for first place.

NDNU was hot from downtown with 15 of their 20 field goals coming from behind the 3-point line. The Argos also played excellent defense, holding the 'Lopes to just 33% shooting. Grand Canyon took an early 13-7 lead before NDNU rallied back to take a three point margin into the break. The Argos started strong in the second, pushing the difference to six points in the opening minutes. However, after the Antelopes took the lead at 40-38, NDNU rattled off a 12-2 run to take over the game for good.

Ashley Wilson set a career high with seven 3-pointers on her way to a game high 21 points. Sandy Perry also reached double figures with 11 points and five assists while Jennifer Dreessen grabbed 13 rebounds.

**lost to Grand Canyon, 67-52 (2/6):** The Notre Dame de Namur women's basketball team had their seven game winning streak snapped with a 67-52 loss to first place Grand Canyon. The Argos remain in second place with a 8-3 conference record while the 'Lopes improved to 10-2. NDNU came out strong in the first half leading most of the way before taking a three point lead into the break. The Argos shot just 40% in the half but knocked down five threes while holding the 'Lopes to 35% shooting.

The Argos continued to lead through the first nine minutes of the second building their margin to as many as seven. However, the tide started to change with ten minutes remaining as the 'Lopes ran off a 22-3 run to take a 14 point lead. Cory Riley led the Argos with a team high 14 points and five assists. She also hit four 3-pointers while Tanaia Keyes and Ashley Wilson each added eight points.

## **Softball: 3-3**

### *Last Week's Results:*

**lost to Sonoma State, 10-0 (2/6)**

**lost to Sonoma State, 5-4 (2/6)**

After taking second place at the Best of the West Tournament last weekend, the Notre Dame de Namur softball team struggled to keep up their winnings ways. The Argos dropped a doubleheader to Sonoma State, falling 10-0 in the first game and 5-4 in the second.

In the first game, the Seawolves jumped on the Argos 10-0. The game remained tight through the first four innings with Sonoma leading 1-0. However, Sonoma State scored nine runs over the final two innings to put the game out of reach.

The second game started the same way with the Seawolves scoring in the first inning to take a 1-0 lead. The Argos tied the score in the second but fell behind once again when SSU scored three more in the bottom of the fifth. NDNU rallied in the sixth to tie the score at four with a three-run double by Bryanne Norris. However, Sonoma retook the lead in the bottom of the six and won 5-4.

Tara Van Meter picked up a pair of hits in each game while Norris drove in three of the Argos four runs on the day. Dani Langit drove in the other run with a RBI single.

## **Lacrosse: 1-0**

### *Last Week's Results:*

**def. Claremont College, 17-10 (2/9):** The Notre Dame de Namur men's lacrosse team overcame a slow start to handle Claremont College 17-10 in the Argos season opener. The first period was tight throughout, with the Cougars striking first with 7:03 remaining. After the Argos took a 2-1 lead into the final minutes of the first, Claremont responded with two goals to go up 3-2. However, Brad Matzek's goal in the final minute tied the score at 3-3.

The Argos would never trail again as the scored 12 of the next 13 goals over the course of the second and third periods. In the second, NDNU outscored the Cougars 8-1 and registered a 17-8 shot advantage. In the second half, NDNU built their lead to 14-4 before Claremont closed the gap to seven in the final minute. For the game, the Argos held a 37-35 shot advantage while Claremont led shots on goal 28-27. Goalies Matthew Coric and Jesse Wilkerson came up big in the net for NDNU, combining for 18 saves.

Tim Campeau led all players with 12 points, tallying four goals and eight assists. Matzek scored six goals and added three assists while Cam Foss tacked on four goals and two assists. Ryan Hulsey's two goals and Jesse Painter's one rounded out the scoring for NDNU.
