ARGO OF THE WEEK

TANIAI KEYES, JR., SEATTLE, WA WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

Keyes helped lead the Argos to a 2-1 record on their three game Hawaii trip this past week. The Argos improved to 11-4 in conference play and are in second place. Keyes averaged a team high 13.0 points per game and added 5.7 rebounds and 3.7 assists for the week.



Teams

Men's Basketball: 9-15 (5-10)

Last Week's Results:

lost to Hawaii Pacific, 61-71 (2/16): In their attempt to sweep the season series with Hawaii Pacific, the Notre Dame de Namur men's basketball came up short, falling 71-61. The Argos moved to 5-10 in PacWest play with three games remaining.

NDNU came out firing in the first half, connecting on 67% of their shots but only taking a one point lead into the break. The Argos led by as many as nine in the first, but ten turnovers allowed the Sea Warriors to remain close. HPU scored the first seven points of the second half to take the lead for good. The Sea Warriors shot 53% in the half and built their margin to as many as 17 in the final minutes.

Ryan Cooper connected on 4-5 three-pointers to lead the Argonauts with 18 points. Chris Clock added 10 while Eric Bossom finished with eight points and nine rebounds.

def. Hawaii Pacific, 71-59 (2/15): The Notre Dame de Namur men's basketball team improved to 5-9 in PacWest play with an impressive 71-59 victory over Hawaii Pacific. The Argos started off strong, dominating the first half and taking a 34-19 lead into the break.

NDNU held the Sea Warriors to 25% shooting in the half while closing the half with a 13-1 run. After pushing the difference to 18 to start the second, HPU ripped off a 26-6 run to take a two point lead. The Argos took the lead for good on a three from Dan Bergeron with 8:01 left and hit 9-11 from the free throw line in the final minutes to preserve the victory.

Bergeron came up big for the Argos, hitting 7 of 11 from the field and leading the team with 20 points and seven rebounds. Chris Clock drained five three-pointers on his way to 19 points while Eric Bossom also reached double figures with ten.

lost to BYU Hawaii Pacific, 65-90 (2/13): The Seasideers used a fast start and big second half run to take down the Notre Dame de Namur men's basketball team 90-65. The Argos moved to 4-9 in Pacific West play with five games left to play.

BYU Hawaii came out fast, taking an early 19-8 lead before going to the break with a 40-28 margin. The Argos shot 49% for the half, but committed nine turnovers and allowed the Seasideers to hit at a 59% clip. The Argos cut the difference to six early in the second half, but a 26-4 BYU run put the game out of reach. NDNU struggled from the field in the second while the Seasideers once again shot over 50%.

Chris Clock paced the Argonauts with 19 points, 12 of which came in the second half. Chris Edwards added 12 points while Ryan Cooper tacked on 11 points and four assists. Dan Bergeron just missed a double-double, finishing with nine points and ten rebounds.

Women's Basketball: 11-12 (11-4)

Last Week's Results:

def. Hawaii Pacific, 70-55 (2/16): The Notre Dame de Namur women's basketball team closed out their Hawaii road trip with a 70-55 victory over HPU. The Argos improved to 11-4 in conference play and went 4-2 in games played in Hawaii.

The first half was close throughout with each team taking leads in the final minutes. The Argos finished the half strong and took a 30-28 margin into halftime. In the second half, NDNU's defense took over, holding the Sea Warriors to 19% shooting. The Argos on the other hand hit 44% of their shots, including five three-pointers.

Jennifer Dreessen led the Argonauts with 13 points while Tanaia Keyes also reached double figures with 10 points, five rebounds and five assists. Ramona Vae just missed a double-double, finishing with eight points and 11 rebounds.

lost to Hawaii Pacific, 60-82 (2/15): The Notre Dame de Namur women's basketball team could not continue their winning ways, falling to Hawaii Pacific 82-60. The Argos moved to 10-4 in conference and remain in second place while HPU evened their record at 7-7.

The Argos stayed close in the first half, trailing 38-34 despite shooting just 38% from the field. However, the Sea Warriors took over to start the second half, opening with a 26-3 run to put the game out of reach. HPU shot 52% in the half while NDNU was held to 29% shooting.

Tanaia Keyes led the Argos with 13 points and six rebounds while Jennifer Dreessen just missed a double-double with nine points and ten rebounds. Cory Riley finished with a team season high six steals.

def. BYU Hawaii Pacific, 68-61 (2/13): The Notre Dame de Namur women's basketball team continued their winning way, toppling BYU Hawaii 68-61. The Argos have won nine of their last ten games and improved to 10-3 in the PacWest with the victory.

BYU Hawaii took an early lead at 6-4 before the Argos ripped off an 11-4 run and never looked back. NDNU led for the final 36 minutes and did not allow the Seaside to cut the lead below five in the second half. The Argos shot just 41% from the field for the game, but forced BYU Hawaii into 31 turnovers. NDNU also held an 8-4 advantage from beyond the arc.

Cory Riley knocked down four three-pointers on her way to a team high 20 points. She also added four steals while Jennifer Dreessen picked up five steals. Tanaia Keyes also reached double figures for the Argos with 16 points.
