def. Saint Martin's, 2-0 (9/11): The Notre Dame de Namur men's soccer team got some revenge on St. Martin's with a 2-0 victory on the road. The Saints defeated the Argos 1-0 in a neutral site game two weeks ago, but could not hold off NDNU attack this time. The Argos used a pair of late second half goals and some stellar work in the net to record their second shutout of the season. After a scoreless first half that saw each team take six shots, the Argos got on the board in the 73rd minute. Sean Fogt scored his first career goal on a bicycle kick off an assist from Emmanuel Vazquez. Vazquez would add an insurance goal two minutes later on a

rebound of the post to give the Argos a 2-0 lead. Sheldon Steenhuis once again manned the net for the Argos and recorded his second shutout in the past three games. He turned away nine shots, including five in the second half. The Argos out shot the Saints 19-13 for the game and had 13-7 advantage in the second half.

lost to Sonoma State, 3-0 (9/15): The Notre Dame de Namur volleyball team could not make it two wins in a row, falling to Sonoma State in three games. The Argos kept the first game close before the Seawolves pulled away and won 30-27. In the second and third games, Sonoma State found their groove, winning 30-20 and 30-15. For the match, the Seawolves enjoyed a 47-37 kill advantage and 11-5 lead in service aces. Freshman Ashley Fox and senior Emily Evans led the Argos with nine kills apiece while Lauren Quach recorded 21 digs. Sonoma State had two players with double digit kills, led Kristy Sather's match high 12 kills. Sarah Illingworth added 10 kills and hit .562 for the match.

def. CSU Monterey Bay, 3-0 (9/14): The Notre Dame de Namur volleyball team enjoyed a 45-27 kill advantage on their way to a three game sweep of CSU Monterey Bay. The Argos downed the Otters for the second time this season after winning in Monterey in August. NDNU started off slow in the first, trailing late in the game before pulling ahead to win 30-27. In the second, with the score 16-14, the Argos broke the game open by taking 12 of the next 13 points and winning 30-19. With the score tied at 13-13 in the third game, NDNU won 17 of the final 24 points to close out the match. Marissa Miller led all players with 16 kills on the night, including 10 in the second game. She hit .429 for the match and added four aces and 10 digs. Lauren Quach finished with 18 digs while Shasta Millhollin and Pamela Alano combined for 33 assists. The Argos held to the Otters to a -.009 attack percentage, forcing CSUMB into 28 errors.

lost to CSU Stanislaus, 2-3 (9/11): Despite having five players with double digit kills, the Notre Dame de Namur volleyball team could not hold off CSU Stanislaus. The Argos struggled in the first game of their home opener, losing 30-25 before rebounding to take the next two 30-28 and 30-22. The Warriors battled from behind in the fourth game to force a fifth and deciding game. In the fifth game, Stanislaus led throughout before winning 15-11 and spoiling the NDNU home opener. The Argos out killed the Warriors in every game and had a 69-45 advantage overall. However, the difference proved to be the 40 attack errors committed by NDNU. Five Argo players reached double figures for the match with Emily Evans leading the way with 17. Marissa Miller and Caitlin Torres finished with 14 and 13 kills respectively while Sarah Perry recorded 12 and Kirby Haynes tacked on 10. Pamela Alano and Shasta Millhollin combined for 56 assists, with Alano leading the way with 31. Lauren Quach recorded 28 digs and freshman Sarah Bagaman finished with six aces for the Argos. Stanislaus was led by Debbi Vander Schaff who finished with 11 kills and Colleen Sullivan who dished out a game high 43 assists.
