def. UC Santa Cruz, 56-45 (1/13): The Notre Dame de Namur women's basketball team picked up their third straight victory with a 56-45 win over UC Santa Cruz. The Argos played their most impressive defensive game of the season, holding the Slugs to just 29% shooting from the field. NDNU never trailed in the game, jumping out to an early lead and never looking back. With the score 9-7 with 13 minutes left in the first, the Argos rattled off eleven unanswered points to take a 13 point lead. NDNU's defense played spectacularly in the first, forcing the Slugs into 12 turnovers and 25% shooting. The second half was much of the same, as the Argos stretched the margin to 18 points before taking home the 11 point victory. NDNU shot 42% for the game including 50% in the second half. Three Argos players reached double figures, led by Grace Hartman's 13 points and seven rebounds. Ramona Vae tacked on 12 points and seven boards while Darice Murray picked up 10 points and four steals. Megan Gaynor had a game high 14 for the Slugs and added five rebounds and four assists. Melissa Junge was the other UCSC player in double figures, scoring 13 points on 6-6 shooting.
