Teams

Men's Basketball: 7-14 (1-10)

lost to BYU Hawaii, 71-55 (2/10): The Notre Dame de Namur men's basketball team could not overcome a big first half lead, losing to BYU Hawaii 81-62. The Argos started off strong, taking a 13-12 lead eight minutes into the game. However, the Seasideers would then go on a 28-13 run to go up by 14 points. NDNU battled back, cutting the deficit to eight at the break. In the second, the Argos got within six but a quick seven point streak by BYU Hawaii broke the game wide open. The Seasideers shot 49% for the game, including 53% in the first half. The Argos struggled from the field in the second, connecting on just 32% of their shots. Chris Clock led the Argos with 19 points on 8-14 shooting. The teams leading scorer, Ryan Cooper finished with just six points but added seven assists. BYU Hawaii was paced by Wu Tai-Hao's 18 points, all of which came in the first half. Eric Boyce and Jermaine Odjegba tacked on 12 points each while Lucas Alves added 10.

lost to Hawaii Pacific, 55-59 (2/8): The Notre Dame de Namur men's basketball team could not make it two Pac West wins in a row, falling to Hawaii Pacific 59-55. The Argos jumped out early, making their first four shots, all threes to take a 12-2 lead in the opening minutes. HPU would then score the next six points and stay close for the rest of the first half. The Argos connected on just 44% of their shots in the first half, but hit 50% from behind the arc to take a 26-22 lead into the break. The second half was a different story as the Sea Warriors quickly erased the deficit and took a four point lead with 15 minutes left. HPU would build the lead up to ten before a pair of Stephen Chang free throws made it a two point game with 55 second remaining. Rishi Kakad came up big in the final minute, hitting all four of his free throws to ice the game for the Sea Warriors. HPU shot 50% in the second half while the Argos made just 33% of their shots. Chris Clock led all players with 19 points and hit five 3-pointers on the night. Ryan Cooper added nine points and five assists while Chris Edwards had four blocks. Brandon Lee paced HPU with a double-double, finishing with 14 points and 10 rebounds. Rishi Kakad tacked on 12 points with Adam Reinking adding 11 points and five steals.

def. Hawaii Pacific, 71-55 (2/7): The Notre Dame de Namur men's basketball team picked up their first ever Pacific West Conference victory with a 71-55 win over Hawaii Pacific. The two teams battled closely for much of the first half with Dan Bergeron's jumper at the buzzer giving the Argos a two point halftime lead. NDNU came out strong in the second, scoring the first eight points and taking a ten point lead. The Sea Warriors cut the deficit to two with eight minutes remaining, but two straight Stephen Chang threes gave NDNU some breathing room. The Argos scored eight straight in the final two minutes to push the margin to as many as 18. NDNU shot 44% for the game including 54% in the second half. The Argos also committed only eight turnovers while forcing HPU into 16. Ryan Cooper led four Argos in double figures with 14 and added four assists. Aaron Parker and Stephen Chang tacked on 12 apiece with all 12 of Chang's points coming in the second half. Chris Clock added 10 while Dan Bergeron grabbed a career high 15 rebounds.

Women's Basketball: 7-16 (6-5)

lost to BYU Hawaii, 72-55 (2/10): The Notre Dame de Namur women's basketball team could not hold off Pacific West rival BYU Hawaii, falling 72-55 in their final home game of the year. The Argos started off slowly, falling behind 8-0. However, the offense picked it up as the Argos went on top 20-18 with just over seven minutes remaining. The Seasideers battles right back, scoring twelve straight and taking a nine point lead into the break. The shot well from the 3-point line in the first half making 5-11, but hit just 5-22 from inside the arc. BYU Hawaii connected on 53% in the half and hit all six of their free throws. The second half was much of the same as NDNU shot just 29% and were outscored by eight. The Argos forced 24 turnovers and hit eight 3-pointers, but shot just 30% for the game. Ashley Wilson paced the Argos offensive attack knocking down four threes on her way to 20 points. Wilson also grabbed five rebounds and had four steals. Senior Grace Hartman scored 15 in her final home game as an Argo. BYU Hawaii had four players in double figures led by Latoya Wily's 21 points and 16 rebounds. Kayla Burningham added 19 while Juanita Afamasaga and Lesina Funaki tacked on 12 and 10 respectively.

def. Hawaii Pacific, 69-62 (2/8): The NDNU women's basketball team snapped their three game conference losing streak with a 69-62 victory over Hawaii Pacific. The two teams battled back and forth all night in a game that saw 12 ties and 13 lead changes. The first half was close throughout with neither team leading by more than five. HPU took a two point lead into halftime on a late jumper by Ashley Jenkins. The second half started with the Sea Warriors going up by four before a quick six points gave the lead back to NDNU. The game continued to seesaw until the eight minute mark when the Argos went ahead for good. Cory Riley's four late free throws sealed the victory in a game where the Argos forced a season high 25 turnovers. Hawaii Pacific out shot NDNU 43% to 40% for the game, but connected on just 37% in the second half. The Argos also outscored the Sea Warriors 21-10 from the free throw line. Cory

Riley poured in a career high 21 points for the Argos and added six rebounds, four assists and four steals. She hit 5-10 from the field and all ten of her free throws. Ramona Vae tacked on 13 points and nine rebounds while Christy Wiens picked up 10 points and eight boards. Ashley Jenkins once again paced the Sea Warriors with 18 points off the bench and Kanani Thomas knocked down four threes on her way to 14 points.

lost to Hawaii Pacific, 57-67 (2/7): The Notre Dame de Namur women's basketball team could not make up a big first half deficit, falling to Hawaii Pacific 67-57. The Argos and Sea Warriors stayed even until the 6:38 mark of the first half. After Ramona Vae tied the game at 17-17, Hawaii Pacific ended the half on a 19-2 run. The Argos shot just 37% in the first while the Sea Warriors connected at 57%. NDNU made a run in the second, cutting the difference to five with just over five minutes remaining. However, HPU would put the game away with a late 7-0 run. The Argos turned the ball over once in the second, but shot just 34%. Kelsey MacKenzie led the way for the Argos with 15 points, all in the second half on 5-6 shooting. Jen Dreessen added six points, six rebounds and four steals while Ashley Wilson tacked on nine points. Ashley Jenkins led three Sea Warriors in double figures with 20 points, five rebounds and five assists. Jocelyn Norris scored 14 and Constance DeCaires added 13 for HPU in the victory.

The Argos and Poets battled back and forth all game long until Campeau's goal with three seconds left sealed the game for the Argos. That would be Campeau's lone goal of the day, but he did add a team high four assists. Cam Foss scored four times for NDNU while Mark Sherman, Jessie Painter and Keegan Davidson added two goals apiece. Justin Der tacked on one goal and three assists and Jon Black added a goal and two assists. Nick Reis picked up a game high seven groundballs and Mike Ferrari once again earned the win in the net by making 11 saves. Anthony Lackey scored five goals for Whittier while Christian Wright added three of his own.
