MARISSA MILLER, SR., LINDEN, CA

VOLLEYBALL

Miller led the NDNU volleyball team to a 3-3 week including a 3-1 record in the CSU East Bay Wild West Invitational. She had a team high 72 kills over the six matches and averaged four kills a game for the week. Miller also added 52 digs, 10 aces and five solo blocks. She put together five straight performances with double digit kills including 18 in a match with Dominican on Saturday.



Teams

Volleyball (10-19, 0-10)

Last Week's Results:

lost to Hawaii Pacific 3-0 (10/9): The NDNU volleyball team suffered another tough loss in conference play, falling to 7-17 on the season. The Argos were swept by the visiting Hawaii Pacific Sea Warriors (29-31,21-30,23-30) and dropped to 0-9 in Pac West play. The Sea Warriors came from behind to take the first game before winning the final two and completing the sweep. HPU tallied 53 kills on the night to 42 from the Argos who also committed nine more errors.

lost to Hawaii Pacific 3-0 (10/10): The Argonauts lost their second straight match to Hawaii Pacific who completed a season sweep of NDNU with a three game victory. The Argos battled tough in the first game, tying the score at 28-28 before HPU won the next two points and took the game. The Sea Warriors won the final two games, connecting on 26 kills and five aces. For the game, HPU tallied 45 kills and had 21 errors while the Argos managed 38 kills and committed 20 errors. Marissa Miller led the Argos attack with 10 kills and also had a team high 14 digs.

def. Menlo College 3-0 (10/13): NDNU started off the Wild West Tournament with sweep of Menlo College. The Argos hit a season high .358, connecting on 46 kills and only 12 errors. Emily Evans led the team with 15 kills while Marissa Miller added 13. Shauna Folan had 22 digs and Jennifer McMurtry recorded 43 assists.

def. UC Santa Cruz 3-0 (10/13): The Argos finished the opening day of the CSU East Bay Tournament with their second straight sweep. NDNU easily handles UC Santa Cruz in three games, capitalizing on 28 errors. The Argos racked up 40 kills and committed only 14 errors. Marissa Miller led the team with 11 kills and added four aces.

def. Dominican University 3-0 (10/14): NDNU turned in one of its most impressive performances of the season with a three game sweep of Dominican. The Argos tallied 62 kills, the second highest total of the season and hit .331 for the match. In the first game, NDNU connected on 22 kills and hit over .400. Marissa Miller paced the team with 18 kills while Val Adams added 13. Joanna Gresh had a team season high 55 assists.

lost to CSU East Bay 3-0 (10/14): The Argos suffered their only loss of the Wild West Tournament to the host team, CSU East Bay Pioneers. CSUEB swept the Argos in three games thanks to hitting .404 as a team. Emily Evans and Marissa Miller combined for 23 kills while Shauna Folan added a team high 18 digs.

Last Week's Results:

def. Chaminade 3-0 (10/12): The Notre Dame de Namur men's soccer team used three goals in the final 20 minutes to defeat Chaminade University 3-0 and improve to 8-4-2 on the season. The Argos moved to 4-1 in Pac West play and were in control throughout the game. They held the Silver Swords to just one shot while tallying 18 shots of their own. Mike Jaso made his first appearance for NDNU and recorded the shutout. The game stayed scoreless until the 72nd minute when Edgar Rivera connected on a shot from 25 yards out to put the Argos on top.

def. Hawaii-Hilo 5-0 (10/14): The NDNU men's soccer team scored early and often to down the Hawaii-Hilo Vulcans 5-0. The Argos improved to 9-4-2 on the season and moved to 5-1 in Pac West play with the victory. Erik Michon and Rigo Pinal each scored a pair of goals while Anthony Putrus added a career high three assists. Nico Arellano and Mike Jaso combined for the shutout as the Argos out shot the Vulcans 14-2.

Women's Soccer (8-6-2, 5-0-1)

Last Week's Results:

tied Central Washington 0-0 (2OT) (10/9): The Notre Dame de Namur Argonauts defense continued to shutdown their opponents, once again not allowing a goal in a 0-0 double overtime tie against Central Washington. The Argos have not allowed a goal in three games and moved to 6-6-2 on the season. Goalie Candice Schrodetzki extended her streak to over 300 minutes without allowing a goal and recorded her fifth shutout of the season. Schrodetzki made three saves, while her counterpart Amber Easterbrook stopped seven shots and held the Argos scoreless.

def. Chaminade 2-0 (10/12): The Notre Dame de Namur Argonauts remained undefeated in conference play with a 2-0 victory over Chaminade University. The Argos racked up 26 shots and did not allow the Lady Swords to get any shots off. NDNU improved to 7-6-2 on the season and are 4-0-1 in Pac West play. The game moved into the second half scoreless until Hope Siffert took a long pass from Tracy Cicerchi and beat the goalie in the 58th minute. Kelli Brackinreed put the Argos up 2-0 in the 64th minute. She drilled a free kick from 20 yards out off the post and into the net.

def. Hawaii-Hilo 6-0 (10/14): The Notre Dame de Namur women's soccer team defeated Hawaii-Hilo 6-0 on Senior Day thanks to a few big performances from those who were honored. The Argos improved to 8-6-2 with the win and remained undefeated in conference play with a 5-0-1 record. Senior Hope Siffert got things started early, scoring the first of her two goals in the 7th minute to put the Argos up 1-0. Three minutes later, senior Kaia Wakamiya scored on an assist from fellow senior Kelli Brackinreed off a corner kick. Sally Olsson added the third and final goal of the half in the 13th minute on a shot from 30 yards that bounced off the crossbar. The second half was much of the same for NDNU as Siffert scored her second goal on another assist from Brackinreed to move the score

to 4-0. Heather Toohey would score her first career goal in the 63rd minute followed by Amy Armijo eighth goal on the season just two minutes later. Senior goalie Candice Schrodetzki extended her scoreless streak to 498 minutes as the team recorded its fifth straight shutout.

Men (7th place) in Chico State Invitational (10/9-10/10): The NDNU men's golf team used two top twenty individual finishes to place seventh in the Chico State Invitational. The Argos shot +49 as a team, finishing 26 shots behind tournament winner CSU San Bernardino. The 54 hole tournament which featured ten teams was played at Canyon Oaks Country Club in Chico, CA. Dean Henry led the way for NDNU, picking up his second straight top ten finish. Henry shot a seven-over-par 223 which was good enough for ninth place. Mike Prescott finished 18th, just three strokes behind Henry.
