CANDICE SCHRODETZKI, SR., FREMONT, CA WOMEN'S SOCCER

Schrodetzki helped lead the Argos to a 4-0 Hawaii road trip, allowing just one goal in the four games. She finished with nine saves, 0.25 goals against average on the trip and recorded three shutouts. Schrodetzki concluded her senior season at NDNU this week with 0.96 goals against average and eight shutouts on the year. She allowed just two goals in ten conference games on the way to leading the Argos to a Pacific West Conference title.



Teams

Volleyball (13-21, 2-12)

Last Week's Results:

def. to CSU Stanislaus 3-1 (10/24): The Notre Dame de Namur volleyball team overcame an early one game deficit to beat CSU Stanislaus in Tuesday's non-conference match. The Argos found themselves behind after a 30-24 victory by the Warriors in the first game. NDNU responded by taking the final three games to win the match 3-1 (24-30, 30-22, 30-27, 30-24). The Argos racked up 59 kills on the night and added nine aces on their way to their 12th victory of the season. Marissa Miller picked up a season high 19 kills and also added 19 digs and three aces. Caitlin Torres tacked on a career best 13 kills while Shauna Folan recorded 29 digs. Sarah Perry led the Argos defensively, picking up seven blocks (2 solo, 5 assisted).

def. to Hawaii-Hilo 3-1 (10/27): The NDNU women's volleyball team rallied back from an early deficit to claim their first Pac West win of the season over Hawaii Hilo 3-1 (27-30, 30-23, 30-21, 30-26). The Argos found themselves down a game despite out killing the Vulcans 17-14 in the opening game. However, NDNU's balanced attack proved too much for Hawaii-Hilo as the Argos took the final three games. NDNU racked up a season high 70 kills and added seven aces while Hilo countered with 51 kills and three aces. The Argos attack was led by a season high four players with double digit kills. Marissa Miller led the way with 20 kills, while Sarah Perry added 18 and hit .444. Caitlin Torres picked up 14 kills and Emily Evans notched 12 of her own. Miller, Perry and Torres all recorded season highs in kills with Miller also adding 27 digs. Shauna Folan had a game high 29 digs and Lauren Quach had 20. Jennifer McMurtry also set an Argo season high with 60 assists.

def. to Hawaii-Hilo 3-1 (10/28): The Notre Dame de Namur women's volleyball took their second straight conference match against Hawaii-Hilo in four games (18-30, 30-23, 30-26, 30-19). The Vulcans once again jumped out to an early lead by taking game one. UHH notched 15 kills in the opening game and hit .333. The Argos bounced back in the second game, using 15 kills to even the match at one game apiece. NDNU rallied to big leads in both the third and fourth games to put the Vulcans away and improve to 13-21 on the season. Hawaii-Hilo had two more kills than NDNU (56-54), but the Argos got a boost from their serving game, racking up 14 aces. NDNU was paced by four players with double digit kills, led by Marissa Miller's 18. Sarah Perry added 13 kills and six blocks while Emily Evans and Caitlin Torres connected on 12 and 10 kills respectively. Miller also finished with 23 digs and four aces. Jennifer McMurtry recorded 46 assists and Lauren Quach added five aces and 13 digs.

Men's Soccer (13-5-2, 9-1)

Last Week's Results:

def. Hawaii-Hilo 4-0 (10/24): The NDNU men's soccer team won their sixth consecutive game with a 4-0 defeat of Hawaii-Hilo. The Argos improved to 10-5-2 on the season and are 6-1 in conference play. The game was decided early, as the Argos poured in four first half goals and out shot the Vulcans 18-2. Eric Michon picked up his third straight two goal game and leads the team with 13 on the season. Michon got the scoring started with an unassisted goal in the 16th minute to put NDNU up 1-0. Anthony Putrus then added his 10th goal of the season in the 24th minute. Nick Hooper would score just three minutes later after taking a pass from Emmanuel Vasquez and beating goalie Marc Fournier. Michon capped off the half with his second goal of the game in the 29th minute. Goalie Nico Arellano recorded his third shutout of the season, making a pair of saves.

def. Chaminade 3-0 (10/25): The Notre Dame de Namur men's soccer team won their seventh straight game in decisive fashion, shutting out Chaminade 3-0. The Argos improved to 11-5-2 overall and are 7-1 in Pac West games. NDNU was on attack from the beginning, tallying 35 shots to only two from the Silverswords. Eric Michon put the Argos on the board with his team leading 14th goal on an assist from Anton Del Rosario. The game remained 1-0 until the 57th minute when Del Rosario found Dorian Virrueta for the Argos second goal of the game. Virrueta would add another goal in the 65th minute on a feed from Anthony Putrus. Goalie Nico Arellano recorded his second consecutive shutout, needing only one save to keep Chaminade scoreless.

def. Hawaii Pacific 5-1 (10/27): The NDNU men's soccer team collected their eighth straight victory with a 5-1 win over Hawaii-Pacific. The Argos improved to 12-5-2 overall and are tied for first in the Pac West with a 8-1 conference record. NDNU did not waste anytime getting started, scoring the first goal of the game in the 10th minute. Emmanuel Vasquez took a throw-in from the corner and beat the HPU goalie for an early 1-0 lead. Eric Michon would give the Argos a 2-0 lead in the 16th minute on his team leading 15th goal of the season. Anthony Putrus added the third goal of the first half in the 39th minute. Andres Caballero tacked on two goals in the second half off assists from Anton Del Rosario and Edgar Rivera.

def. BYU Hawaii 3-1 (10/28): The NDNU men's soccer team won their final game of the season 3-1 over BYU Hawaii. The Argos finished the season with nine straight wins and a 13-5-2 overall record. Anthony Putrus scored a pair of goals, the first one in the opening minute to give the Argos a 1-0 lead. Putrus netted his second goal in the 31st minute on a rebound off a free kick. The Seaside cut the lead in half in the 37th minute when Aaron Nonnenmacher headed in a throw-in from the right side. The game stayed 2-1 until the 75th minute when Anton Del Rosario added an insurance goal to preserve the NDNU victory. Nico Arellano once again manned the net for the Argos, making one save.

Women's Soccer (12-6-2, 9-0-1)

Last Week's Results

def. Hawaii-Hilo 2-1 (10/24): The NDNU women's soccer team moved to 6-0-1 in Pac West play with a 2-1 victory over Hawaii-Hilo. The Argos offense controlled the ball for most of the game, compiling 27 shots to only two from the Vulcans. NDNU jumped out early with a goal in the 4th minute to go up 1-0. Morgan King took a long pass from Kristen Orlando and beat Vulcan goalie

Kelly Herbst to put the Argos on top. Hawaii-Hilo was able to tie the game in the 26th minute after a NDNU hand ball in the penalty box. Karen Weatherby was able to beat Candice Schrodetzki on the penalty kick and even the game at one apiece. The game remained tied until the 67th minute when Julie Loucks netted the game winning goal from the left side.

def. Chaminade 4-0 (10/25): The Notre Dame de Namur women's soccer team continued their winning ways, shutting out Chaminade University 4-0. The Argos remained unbeaten in their last ten games, and improved to 7-0-1 in Pac West play. The Argos were on the attack all game long, racking up 32 shots to only three from the Swords. Amy Armijo put NDNU on top in the 14th minute, beating the goalie on a feed from Julie Loucks. Kelli Brackinreed added the second goal on the first half in the 28th minute, scoring from the left side on a pass from Armijo. With the score 2-0 in the second half, the Argos added a pair of late insurance goals to put the game out of reach. Lesley Welch tacked on the third goal in the 87th minute on Armijo's second of her three assists in the game. Brackinreed would add her second goal of the game less than two minutes later to end the scoring at 4-0. Candice Schrodetzki picked up her sixth shutout of the season, making two saves.

def. Hawaii Pacific 6-0 (10/27): The NDNU women pulled off another impressive victory with a 6-0 shutout of Hawaii-Pacific. The Argos kept the pressure on all game long, totaling 27 shots to only five from the Sea Warriors. Kelli Brackinreed had her second consecutive two goal game, both coming in the first half and giving the Argos a 2-0 lead at halftime. Brackinreed's goals came at the 20 and 34 minute marks with Yang Zhou and Julie Loucks each assisting on one. The Argos picked up the second half right where they left off, tacking on four more goals. Loucks scored in the 54th minute to give NDNU a 3-0 lead before Amy Armijo added the fourth goal less than a minute later. Lyndsey Schiffman and Morgan King would each add a goal to finish off the scoring. Candice Schrodetzki made four saves on the way to her seventh shutout of the season.

def. BYU Hawaii 1-0 (10/28): The Notre Dame de Namur women's soccer team captured their first ever Pacific West Conference title with a 1-0 victory over BYU Hawaii. NDNU used an early second half goal from Hope Siffert to win their eighth straight game. The Argos finished up conference play with a 9-0-1 record and out scored their opponents 27-2 over that stretch. The game was very close from the beginning, with NDNU narrowly out shooting the Seaside 6-5. Candice Schrodetzki made two saves in her final collegiate game and recorded her eighth shutout of the season. Siffert provided the only offense the Argos needed, taking a corner kick from Yang Zhou and heading it into the net.

Last Week's Results:

Men (3rd place) in Sonoma State Invitational (10/23-10/24): The NDNU men's golf team finished the Sonoma State Invitational in a tie for third place. The Argos finished the 54 hole, nine team tournament just nine strokes behind the winner, CSU Stanislaus. Mike Prescott and Kory Storer led the Argos, each shooting a five-over-par (221) and tying for 12th place. Dean Henry finished just one stroke back in 16th place while Garrett Baxley shot a school record four-under-par (68) in the second round.
