ARGO OF THE WEEK

CHRIS CLOCK, JR., LOS GATOS, CA MEN'S BASKETBALL

Clock led the Argos in scoring this past week, averaging 16.0 points per game at the Lawrence R. DeBani Memorial Classic in Arcata, CA. He poured in a season high 20 points, including four 3-pointers in the Argos opening round game against Humboldt State. Clock followed that up with 12 points in the consolation game against Western Oregon.

Men's Basketball (5-3)

Last Week's Results:

lost to Western Oregon, 80-71 (12/16): The NDNU men's basketball team dropped their second straight game at the Lawrence R. DeBani, Sr. Memorial Classic with a 80-71 defeat to Western Oregon. The Wolves led by as many as nine points in the first half, and went into the locker room with a 37-32 lead. However, the beginning of the second half was a different story as the Argos went on a 21-3 run in the first five minutes. NDNU scored the first 12 points of the half, with Eric Bossom picking up six during that stretch. The Argos would increase their lead to 16 points with 12:31 to go after a jumper by Dan Bergeron. Western Oregon would not go away as they would then go on a run of their own, reeling off 13 consecutive points to pull within three. WOU used three treys during the run, including two by Ryan Schmidt. The Argos still maintained their lead until two free throws tied the game at 66-66 with 2:53 left. The Wolves would go ahead for good with just over a minute left and end the game on a 14-5 run. The Argos had a season high five players in double figures, with Dan Bergeron turning in 16 points, eight rebounds, six assists, two steals and two blocks. Stephen Chang added 13 points of the bench, while Ryan Cooper, Chris Clock and Eric Bossom also scored at least ten points. The Wolves were led by Ryan Schmidt's 24 points and eight rebounds and 17 points from Dominique DeWeese. Schmidt hit four of Western Oregon's 10 threes on the night. The Wolves also outscored the Argos 20-4 from the charity stripe.

lost to Humboldt State, 76-62 (12/15): The Notre Dame de Namur Argonauts could not hold off Humboldt State in the first game of the Lawrence R. DeBani, Sr. Memorial Classic in Arcata, CA. The Lumberjacks got off to a fast start and never looked back, winning the contest 76-62. The Argos found themselves down 10 at halftime after shooting only 43% in the half and committing 15 turnovers. NDNU rebounded in the second half, hitting 15 of 25 shots including four 3-pointers, but could not close the gap. Humboldt led by as many as 21 points in the second half before a late run by the Argos. Chris Clock led three Argos in double figures with 20 points and hit a season high four 3-pointers. Ryan Cooper added 11 points and Eric Bossom tacked on 10 and four rebounds. The Lumberjacks used a balanced attack with four starters scoring at least 12 points. Kevin Johnson recorded a double-double, finishing with 15 points and 11 rebounds. Devin Love contributed 15 of his own, while Jeremiah Love added 12 points and five steals.

Women's Basketball (0-8)

lost to CSU Dominguez Hills, 61-44 (12/18): The Notre Dame de Namur women's basketball team dropped a tough road game to CSU Dominguez Hills 61-44. The Argos struggled in the first half and found themselves down by 20 at halftime. With the game 15-9 with just over eight minutes to play in the first, the Argos closed out the half on a 20-6 run. NDNU rebounded in the second half, outscoring CSUDH 29-26 but could not overcome the deficit. The Argos committed 26 turnovers and shot just 32% for the game. Dominguez hit 50% of their shots in the first half, but were held to just 33% in the second. Ashley Wilson led the Argos in scoring with nine points, all coming on 3-pointers. Ramona Vae added eight points off the bench while Jennifer Dreessen picked up ten rebounds. Jessica Liang connected on four treys for the Argos to finish with a game high 14 points.
