Men's Basketball: 6-12 (0-8)

def. Dixie State, 64-63 (2/3): The Notre Dame de Namur men's basketball team took a break from conference play to take on future Pac West member Dixie State in St. George, Utah. The Argos came out on top, downing the Rebels 64-63 in a back and forth contest. The two teams started out trading buckets but with Dixie State up 10-9, the Argos rattled off 13 straight points to take a double digit lead. The Rebels battled back, cutting the lead to five with three minutes left in the half. However, NDNU closed strong and went into the break with a ten point margin. The second half was a different story, as DSC would reclaim the lead. After a Stephen Chang 3-pointer gave the Argos a 12 point advantage, the Rebels responded with a 16-0 run to go up by four points. The final ten minutes saw both teams cling to small leads, until the Argos pull ahead in the final minutes. Eric Bossom scored NDNU's final eight points and a missed three at the buzzer by Dixie State preserved the win. The Argos shot 45% for the game, including 57% in the first half. They also forced 14 turnovers for the while only committing seven of their own. Eric Bossom led three Argos in double figured with 15 points, 13 of which came in the second half. Stephen Chang and Chris Clock knocked down three shots each from behind the arc on their way to 13 and 11 points respectively. Troy Randall poured in a game high 28 points for the Rebels while Ryan Sanchez tacked on 11 points and 14 rebounds.

def. UC Davis, 15-4 (2/3): The NDNU men's lacrosse team started out the 2007 season strong with a 15-4 victory over visiting UC Davis. The Argos used ten straight second half goals to keep the Aggies playing from behind. UC Davis struck first, scoring the first goal just two minutes into the game. NDNU responded back, scoring the next five goals, including two with a man up. The Aggies made the game close, scoring three straight to cut the Argo lead to one thirty seconds into the third period. However, that would be as close as UC Davis would get. The Argos fired off ten straight goals, including six unanswered to end the third quarter. Tim Campeau led the NDNU attack, picking up a hat trick and added four assists and five groundballs. Justin Der added two goals and two assists, while Keegan Davidson, Mark Scherman and JC Vera each tacked on a pair of goals. Jon Black and Cam Foss each scored a goal and added an assist. Goalie Mike Ferrari picked up the win, making seven saves for the game. Conrad Clevlen won 11 of 13 face-offs and had a game high eight groundballs. Daniel Vilar scored a pair of goals for the Aggies who were out shot 46-20.

Best of the West Tournament Day 1 (2/2)

lost to CSU Monterey Bay, 5-0 (2/2); def. CSU Chico, 5-4 (2/2)

The Notre Dame de Namur softball team opened their 2007 season with a split of a pair of games at the Togo's Best of the West Tournament in Turlock, CA. The Argos opened 5-0 loss to CSU Monterey Bay before rebounding to defeat Chico State 5-4. In the first game, the NDNU bats could not get going, managing only four hits. Cierra Kenney toed the rubber for the Argos, picking up her first loss of the season despite giving up only three earned runs. Kate Elwell went 2 for 2 for NDNU while Anna Garza and Milana Jordan each picked up a hit. Jessica Boyle picked up the victory for the Sea Otters, hurling four and one-thirds innings of scoreless ball. Ashlee Trotter led the Monterey offense with a pair of hits and two RBIs. NDNU's bats came alive in the second game on their way to a 5-4 victory over CSU Chico. The Argos fell behind early 1-0, surrendering a run in the bottom of the second. However, the lead would not last long as NDNU put up five runs in the top of the third. Milana Jordan belted a two run homerun and Amy Paulson drove in a pair of her own to put the Argos up 5-1. Chico scored three in the bottom of the inning, but could not tie the game as pitcher Tara Van Meter held them scoreless for the final four innings. Van Meter picked up the win, pitching a complete game while allowing just three earned runs.

Best of the West Tournament Day 2 (2/3)

lost to CSU Dominguez Hills, 6-0; def. UC San Diego, 9-6

The NDNU softball team once again split a pair of games on day two of the Togo's Best of the West Tournament. Much like the first day the Argo bats could not get going in the first game, falling to CSU Dominguez Hills 6-0. NDNU would fair much better in game two, defeating UC San Diego 9-6. In the first game the Toros' starting pitcher Jennifer Martinez kept the Argos silent at the plate, tossing a four hit complete game shutout. Martinez did not walk a batter and struck out eight. Friday's winning pitcher Tara Van Meter hurled her second complete game of the season, but allowed five earned runs. Jennifer Frazier collected three hits for Dominguez Hills and drove in a pair of runs. The Argos regrouped in the second game to take down UC San Diego with a nine run outburst. NDNU jumped out early, plating three runs in the bottom of the first inning. However, UCSD would not go away, taking the lead in the fourth on a three run homerun by Nikki Palmer. The Argos scored two in the bottom of the inning to go up 5-4, but the lead would not last as the Tritons brought home two of their own in the fifth. NDNU would put the game out of reach in the bottom half of the fifth, pushing across four runs to go ahead 9-6. Danielle Holt picked up the victory with five strong innings while Cierra Kenney recorded the save with a pair of scoreless frames. Amy Paulson led the Argos offense with a pair of hits, three runs and a RBI. Bria De Lorenzo also drove in a pair of runs for the Argos.

Best of the West Tournament Day 3 (2/4)

lost to Sonoma State, 3-1; def. #22 Seattle University, 4-2

The Notre Dame de Namur softball team picked up their third straight split at the Togo's Best of the West Tournament in Turlock, CA. The Argos dropped their first game of the day to Sonoma State 3-1, but rebounded with an upset over #22 Seattle University 4-2. The Argos could not get anything going off Sonoma State pitcher Brittany Williams who allowed only one run in six innings. The Argos lone run came on a solo homerun by Tara Van Meter which tied the game at 1-1 in the top of the second inning. NDNU pitcher Laurel Carstensen held the Seawolves to just the one run until the bottom of the sixth when they would plate the games final two runs to win 3-1. Carstensen hurled five innings, allowing just two earned runs but received her first loss of the season. In the second game, NDNU pulled off the upset of nationally ranked Seattle University with a 4-2 victory. Seattle struck first, taking a 2-0 lead in the bottom of the third. However, the Argos responded with four runs in the fifth to take and lead and never look back. Tara Van Meter picked up her second win of the season, allowing just two runs in seven innings. Van Meter also led the Argos at the plate, picking up a double and a triple and driving in a run. Kate Elwell went 3-3 for the game while Milana Jordan and Bria De Lorenzo each drove in a run.
