## Implementation of Drug and Alcohol Abuse Prevention Practices at NDNU:

### Current Measures:

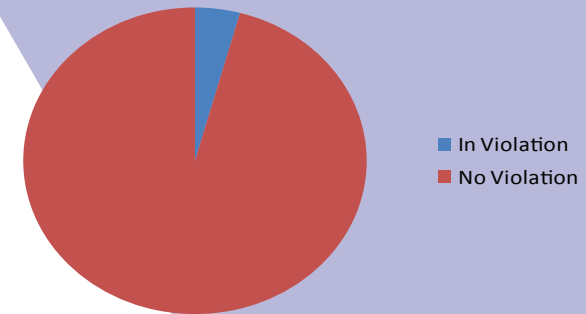
Upon acceptance at Notre Dame de Namur University students are engrossed in an orientation program that introduces both parents and students to our alcohol education program, prevention methods and student conduct process prior to their arrival. One of the first components is an AlcoholEdu mandated program for all first year, incoming students. This alcohol education program requires all students to complete a pre-program assessment as well as a post-program assessment. In addition, parents and students are invited to participate in many of the other modules offered. This includes but is not limited to the Parents Course and two Alcohol Sanctions courses. Should students violate the drug and alcohol policy, a three tier, multiple step guide is applied for consistent alcohol sanctioning. These sanctions include parental notification, fines, AlcoholEdu Sanctions classes, probation, and in severe situations, removal of students' privilege to remain in NDNU housing.

### Future Plan:

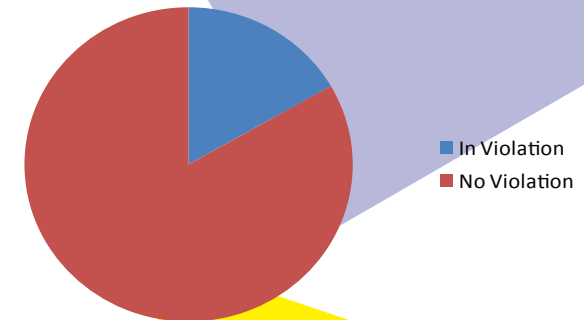
The Division of Student Affairs at Notre Dame de Namur University intends to continue an extensive and proactive Drug and Alcohol Abuse prevention plan. This includes the continued use of AlcoholEdu with an expansion of our current use of the Parent module. We plan to solicit all parents participation. It is also our goal to increase the co-curricular nature of our alcohol education and prevention program by working with First Year Experience classes to have a video/artistic competition "Thinking Out of the Bottle." The students will use social media to campaign against binge drinking, violations of school alcohol policy and state law regarding the legal age for consumption of alcohol. Lastly, as part of any comprehensive intervention program about high risk drinking behaviors, we will increase student programming about sexual assault and alcohol, as well as student health and wellness to combat underage and inappropriate alcohol/drug use.

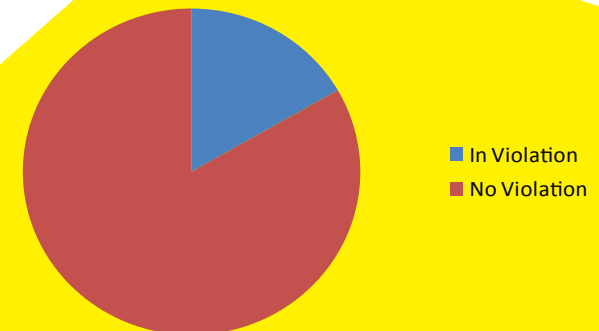
Total Enrolled Students in Violation
