

Undergraduate and Graduate English Articulation Program

This program allows outstanding undergraduate English majors to begin graduate studies during their senior year. Fourth-year students with GPA's of 3.5 or above may take up to 6 units of graduate credit that count toward completion of their undergraduate and graduate degrees. Graduate English courses satisfy elective courses now required of the undergraduate English major. Admission to the program is determined by the English Department Chair and the MAE Program Director. This program goes into effect in spring 2008.

- Students must obtain permission of their major advisor in order to enter this program.
- Only elective courses in English may be satisfied by graduate courses.
