Policy for Awarding Transfer Credit. With the exception of remedial or vocational courses, NDNU accepts credit for courses completed with grade " C " (2.0) or higher at any degree-granting regionally-accredited two-year college or four-year college or university. Courses from California Community Colleges are generally accepted according to the published recommendations for transfer of courses to the California State University system.

Conversion of Quarter Units to Semester Units. NDNU is on the semester system. Quarter units are based on 30 hours of instruction; semester units on 40 hours. 3 qtr units $=2$ sem units 4 qtr units $=2.67$ sem units 4.5 qtr units $=3.0$ sem units 5 qtr units $=3.33$ sem units 6 qtr units $=4$ sem units. Note: an LTCC course that is 4 quarter units ( 2.67 semester units) may be used to satisfy the content of a 3 semester unit GE requirement, but only 2.67 semester units will be awarded. The student will need to make up the missing . 33 units, if required, to complete 124 semester units for graduation.

Section B: A second course in World History (above) is required for entering freshmen, and preferred for transfer students. Transfer students may also satisfy the Section B requirement through one of the following General History courses.

Western Civilization courses will not satisfy the Section A or Section B requirement if taken in Fall 2015 or thereafter; but may satisfy the requirement if taken in a prior semester at an institution in which the course appears on the prior corresponding articulation agreement.

CULTURAL DIVERSITY. The Cultural Diversity Requirement generally does not add units to a student's program. Rather, it is intended to be fulfilled by choosing courses from the approved list that also satisfy requirements in other areas of the student's program; the exception is that Cultural Diversity courses may not satisfy Culture and Language Requirements for B.S. students. For example, HIST 109/Multicultural History of the United States can fulfill (3) units of the Behavioral Science requirement and (3) units of the Cultural Diversity requirement. This double counting of a class may only be done with the Cultural Diversity requirement. Courses in Cultural Diversity may be taken at the lower-division or upper-division level.
