	Cultural Diversity Note: In addition to fulfilling the Cultural Diversity requirement, these courses may also be used to fulfill some of the above General Education requirements, essentially using 1 course to complete 2 requirements. For example, Anthropology 3 can fulfill part of the Behavioral Science requirement and part of Cultural Diversity.
