WORLD HISTORY. Transfer students (30 or more transferable units) may fulfill the History requirement by satisfying Section A and Section B History requirements as described in the NDNU catalog. Note: History coursework taken by any student prior to matriculation at NDNU may be transferred in to satisfy NDNU's World History requirement, provided course content meets the criteria for Section A and/or Section B requirements in the NDNU catalog. After matriculation, only World History coursework may be transferred in by any student to satisfy this requirement. Please be advised that effective Fall 2012, Western Civilization courses will no longer meet the World History requirement, if World History courses are offered at CCSF.

MODERN LANGUAGE/CULTURE AND LANGUAGE. Students who have completed the third-year level of one foreign language in high school with a grade of C (2.0) or higher in each term are exempt from the foreign language requirement. All B.A. and B.F.A. students must take two semesters of the same Modern Language unless eligible for exemption. For majors leading to a B.S. degree, Foreign Culture and Language courses (usually taken at NDNU) may be substituted for Foreign Language.

CULTURAL DIVERSITY. The Cultural Diversity Requirement generally does not add units to a student's program. Rather, it is intended to be fulfilled by choosing courses from the approved list that also satisfy requirements in other areas of the student's program; the exception is that Cultural Diversity courses may not satisfy Culture and Language Requirements for B.S. students. For example, Anthropology 3 can fulfill (3) units of the Behavioral Science requirement and (3) units of the Cultural Diversity requirement. This double counting of a class may only be done with the Cultural Diversity requirement.

Further limitations on transfer may exist for specific programs; please consult with your transfer counselor.
