Note: History coursework taken by any student prior to matriculation at NDNU may be transferred in to satisfy NDNU's World History requirement, provided course content meets the criteria for Section A (World History) and/or Section B (Area Studies) requirements. After matriculation, only World History coursework may be transferred in by any student to satisfy this requirement. The only exception to the World History requirement for transfer courses taken after matriculation is for courses from a school that does not offer World History (effective Fall 2012 catalog). MODERN LANGUAGE/CULTURE AND LANGUAGE. CULTURAL DIVERSITY. The Cultural Diversity Requirement generally does not add units to a student's program. Rather, it is intended to be fulfilled by choosing courses from the approved list that also satisfy requirements in other areas of the student's program; the exception is that Cultural Diversity courses may not satisfy Culture and Language Requirements for B.S. students. For example, Anthropology 3 can fulfill (3) units of the Behavioral Science requirement and (3) units of the Cultural Diversity requirement. This double counting of a class may only be done with the Cultural Diversity requirement. Courses in Cultural Diversity may be taken at the lower-division or upper-division level.
