Please note: You do not need to complete all of these requirements before transferring to NDNU.

The agreement reflects the general education requirements for NHU students who enter with fewer than 60 units toward the NHU degree. Please see your transfer counselor for more information on the requirements for students who enroll with 60-89 units, or 90+ units, toward the NHU degree.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT. Freshman Year Seminar courses include a community engagement component; in addition, all undergraduates must take a 3-unit lower or upper division course designated as a Community Engagement Course.

CULTURAL DIVERSITY. The Cultural Diversity Requirement generally does not add units to a student's program. Rather, it is intended to be fulfilled by choosing courses from the approved list that also satisfy requirements in other areas of the student's program; the exception is that Cultural Diversity courses may not satisfy Culture and Language Requirements for B.S. students. For example, Ethnic Studies 134 can fulfill (3) units of the Behavioral Science requirement and (3) units of the Cultural Diversity requirement. This double counting of a class may only be done with the Cultural Diversity requirement. Courses in Cultural Diversity may be taken at the lower-division or upper-division level.
