With the exception of remedial or vocational courses, NDNU accepts credit for courses completed with grade "C" (2.0) or higher at any degree-granting regionally-accredited two-year college or four-year college or university. Courses from California Community Colleges are generally accepted according to the published recommendations for transfer of courses to the California State University system.

Starting in Fall 2015, Western Civilization courses will not satisfy the Section A or Section B requirement, unless the course appears on a prior articulation agreement with Woodland Community College, corresponding to the year and term in which the course was taken.

Rather, it is intended to be fulfilled by choosing courses from the approved list that also satisfy requirements in other areas of the student's program; the exception is that Cultural Diversity courses may not satisfy Culture and Language Requirements for B.S. students. For example, ETHN 6 – History of Race and Ethnicity in America, can fulfill (3) units of the Behavioral Science requirement and (3) units of the Cultural Diversity requirement. This double counting of a class may only be done with the Cultural Diversity requirement. Courses in Cultural Diversity may be taken at the lower-division or upper-division level.]
