- ✓ A GPA of 2.0 or above, ability to transfer in a total of 78 units, with a minimum of 45 transferable units from other regionally accredited institutions.
- ✓ Intro to Psych/General Psych (pre-requisite which can be taken at NDNU concurrently during first semester)



## Program Overview

- A robust general psychology curriculum recommended by the American Psychological Association.
- Coursework covers various subfields of psychology, including clinical, social, and experimental psychology.
- All 60 AA-T Psychology credits transfer.
- Ability to transfer in a total of 78 units, with a minimum of 45 transferable units from other regionally accredited institutions.
- The program for full-time students can be completed in as few as four semesters.
- Courses are formatted in 8-week terms, 2 terms per semester.
- Program includes individual research and study in major areas of psychology.
- Community-based learning: Requires 15 hours of in-the-field experience at a community organization (or organizations) of your choosing.
- Access to Graduate Level Clinical Psychology Courses: 12 units available at the price of undergraduate courses. Courses are directly transferable to the NDNU MSCP program if the student chooses that path.
- Access to all NDNU Resources including the disability resources center, academic success center, Handshake, library resources, and more.
- Coursework introduces students to the application of psychology in related fields, providing a professional pathway to career opportunities and graduate work.
